

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING SNOW EMERGENCY ROUTES IN THE TOWN OF GREENWOOD, PROVIDING PARKING REGULATIONS FOR SUCH ROUTES, PROVIDING FOR THE TOWING AND STORAGE OF MOTOR VEHICLES PARKED IN VIOLATION OF THE PROVISIONS HEREOF, AND PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATION THEREOF.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Town Council of Greenwood, in Council met, in the manner following, to wit:

Section 1. The following streets are hereby established as Snow Emergency Routes:

(a) Market Street from Route 13 to the Western corporate limits.

Section 2. Upon receiving from the United States Weather Bureau a firm forecast of sleet or snowfall, the Town Mayor shall issue an alert and when heavy precipitation appears imminent, he may declare a Snow Emergency by causing an announcement thereof to be made through the press, if possible, but in no event by less than two (2) radio stations whose normal range covers the Town of Greenwood and its surrounding area.

Section 3. After a Snow Emergency has been officially declared, as provided by this Ordinance, and until it is officially terminated by the Town Mayor, all motor vehicles that are parked on the surface of the streets set forth and enumerated in Section 1 of this Ordinance shall be removed by the owner or operator thereof, as the parking of all motor vehicles on the streets designated herein as Snow Emergency Routes is hereby prohibited during the time that a Snow Emergency has been officially declared.

Section 4. During a sleet or Snow Emergency as declared by the Town Manager, any police officer of the Town, while in the performance of his duty, may remove and store, or cause to be removed and stored from any street enumerated in Section 1 of this Ordinance as a Snow

Emergency Route, any motor vehicle parked or left standing on any such street when the owner or operator is unable, unwilling or unavailable to move such motor vehicle. Any such removal, or storage, or both provided for herein shall be at the expense of the owner or operator of such motor vehicle.

Section 5. Any person violating any of the provisions of this Ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof in a court of competent jurisdiction, shall be fined not less than Five Dollars (\$5.00) nor more than Twenty-five Dollars (\$25.00) and shall pay the costs of prosecution, and shall pay the costs of towing and storing the said motor vehicle..

Section 6. This Ordinance shall become effective upon the erection by the Town Mayor of appropriate signs on the streets described in Section 1 of this Ordinance.
