The Woodbridge School District is back in session starting September 7th. Please be aware of students walking to bus stops and to school throughout each school day.

Learn and obey the school bus laws, as well as, the “flashing signal light system” that school bus drivers use to alert motorists of pending actions:

-Yellow flashing lights indicate the bus is preparing to stop to load or unload children.

Motorists should slow down and be prepared to stop their vehicles.

-Red flashing lights and extended stop arms indicate the bus has stopped and children are getting on or off. Motorists MUST stop their vehicles and wait until the red lights stop flashing, the extended stop-arm is withdrawn, and the bus begins moving before they can start driving again.
