A3B Grass Ordinance

In addition to a maximum 8" grass height, this ordinance states that:

No hedges, bushes, shrubs, trees, or other vegetation shall be permitted to grow in such a manner as to:

- 1). inhibit the visibility or the free passage of any motor vehicle on any street, alley, or passageway.
- 2). extend over the edge of any street, alley, walkway, or passageway, except at a height that will not inhibit the free passage of pedestrians or motor vehicle traffic.

If you have trees or shrubs that overhang the street or sidewalk, please be respectful of your neighbors and trim them back. Be aware that some drive taller vehicles or motorhomes as well.
